### Learn more about your photo

When you see ⓘ, tap it, then tap Look Up to learn more about the art, landmarks, nature, books, or pets in your photo

Find a friend:



### Find a friendly face

You can search for photos of a person by name. To assign a name to a face in a photo, tap ⓘ, then tap a person's thumbnail. Tap All Photos, then tap Add Name.

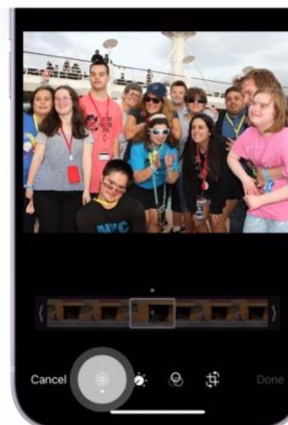


### Magnify objects near you

You can use the Magnifier app to read the fine print, see in dim lighting, and more. Drag the slider to zoom in. To adjust the brightness, swipe up and tap ☀️.

Change a Live Photo:

### Change a Live Photo keyframe

Edit a Live Photo to capture just the right moment. Tap Edit, tap ⌚, drag the frame, then tap Make Key Photo.

## Night Photo Tips:




1. Open Camera & navigate to the photo mode.
2. If the moon icon is highlighted yellow, it means it's auto enabled and ready for use.
3. Next, tap the upward-facing arrow at the top & then the yellow moon icon at the bottom to adjust exposure time.
4. Hold the phone as still as possible during your night capture.
5. The yellow moon icon indicates for how long, and a countdown will also appear above the shutter button.

## Basic Photo Practices:



### KEEP THE LENSES CLEAN

Ensures clear and sharp photos by preventing smudges and debris from affecting image quality.

### TAKE IMAGES NOT PHOTOS

"Images" are capturing the feelings and the beauty of a moment, while "photos" are just quick pictures.



### RULE OF THIRDS

The rule of thirds divides an image with lines into nine parts, where key elements are placed at intersections or along lines for balanced composition.

### FIND GOOD LIGHT

Find natural or soft lighting to avoid harsh shadows and ensure well-lit subjects.



### USE HDR MODE

Utilize your smartphone's High Dynamic Range (HDR) mode to capture more detail in both bright and dark areas of your photos.
